#### **Endowment Fund Committee**

The Endowment Committee had our first organizational meeting, conducted virtually, on August 25, 2021, to discuss goals for the 2021-2022 year.

- The balance of the Heritage Endowment Fund, as of June 30, 2021, was \$129,371.33. The fund is managed by the Cleveland Foundation, https://www.clevelandfoundation.org/.
- Michelle Blackford from The Cleveland Foundation spoke at the General Meeting, November 18, 2021, held at the Gage House, 47 S. State St., Painesville. She spoke about the WRJSL Heritage Endowment and answered questions from our members that attended both in person and online via Zoom.
- The main discussion among members was whether to invest funds raised from WRJSL annual fundraisers (Candlelight Gala, Night-At-The-Races, Bag Brunch, etc.), immediately into the Endowment Fund to earn interest until withdrawn for each grant cycle. During the time the money is deposited and then withdrawn again, the fund has the potential to earn \$500 in interest, depending on market strength, value, and volatility.
- We talked about a campaign for growing the endowment fund through matching gifts (via employer benefits), Benevolent Giving (donations can be made "In memory of...") and payment plans for Founding 50 members.
- We held the biennial Endowment Tea for Sustainers, past Presidents, and Founding 50 Members on April 24, 2022, at Quail Hollow Country Club; 18 guests attended. Michelle Blackburn from the Cleveland Foundation presented the status of our Heritage Endowment Fund and discussed options for growth and utilization.
  - Attendance for the event was low. The Board Sustainer Advisors held a tea for the sustainers a month before, and many who attended that tea did not elect to attend the Endowment Tea. Recommend Sustainer Advisors communicate what the planned sustainer activities are for the year, with Ways & Means and Endowment Committee chair members, to deconflict event schedules.
- Newsletter We passed out copies of a past Newsletter at the Endowment Tea, as an example. Recommend the Endowment Newsletter be sent with a pledge card every year in the beginning of the season, to all current Sustainers, past

Presidents and Founding 50 Members to solicit donations to the Endowment Fund.

• This year we added 2 **new Founding 50 members**, Kathie Hannibal and Rita Antalovich.

The Endowment Committee managed its own **spring fundraiser** for the Endowment Fund (approved through Ways & Means and membership vote). The Endowment Committee Co-Chairs collaborated with a local artist who hand-paints rain barrels. The rain barrel purchase for \$80 was donated by Pam Morse. The artist donated her time and paint supplies by painting a beautiful floral theme on the barrel, which was raffled off through the RallyUp website. The raffle raised \$1560 through online donations and raffle ticket purchases. After platform fees were deducted, the amount deposited into the Endowment Fund was \$1503.05. The winner also received four tickets for a one-time visit to Holden Arboretum and lunch for four, at Sisters Tea Room.

As of March 31, 2022, the Fund balance was **\$127,356.92**. An updated amount will not be available until the June 30, 2022, account statement is released (in August).

August – Produced binders for the Provisional class and delivered to the Provisional Chair prior to Provisional Welcome.

October – Attended Provisional Meeting to provide overview of Policy and Bylaw Committee.

January – Procedure update presented to committee, Board, and Membership to update Leadership Lake County to Leadership Programs to include Ashtabula and Geauga counties in the Procedure section. As this was only a Procedure, not a Bylaw change a vote is not required.

First committee meeting held via Zoom to discuss the process for Bylaw and Procedure review. We agreed to some standard committee language and divided up committees to reach out to Chairs for their review and updates.

February - April – We met in person! We began going through updates we had received, correcting spelling, punctuation, and formatting. We used sticky notes to create a "parking lot" of any items we could not resolve during the meeting. We thoroughly reviewed the Bylaws looking for inconsistencies and ambiguous statements. Due to the number of changes, we agreed to hold Procedure updates until after the Bylaws are approved by the membership. We created a change log of significant changes. Robyn presented our suggested Bylaw changes at the April Board meeting and made a few updates based on Board feedback. As the April General meeting had a large agenda, and the current Bylaw requires amendments be made by a vote at a meeting after ten days' notice, we decided to hold a special Zoom meeting for the vote.

May – Special Zoom meeting to vote was held. The amendment passed. Final formatting changes were made prior to publishing of the 2022 Bylaws. We reviewed Procedure updates we had received from Committee Chairs ensuring they did not contradict the updated Bylaws. Updates were emailed to Committee Chairs for review prior to being posted on website and membership.

## President's Yearbook Report 2021 – 2022 Yearbook

What an amazing year we had! It is astounding to me that, even with all this year's "emerging from COVID" challenges, we were still able to meet or exceed our goals for fundraising.

As you all know, this past year got off to an uneven start as we were discussing topics that were unimaginable for our organization in the past. Was it uncomfortable? Yes. Are we better for it? Yes. Even though it was difficult, I think it made us understand each other and other's beliefs better. We must continue to be free to communicate with each other – in a respectful way – in order to grow to meet our full potential.

And during this tumultuous year, our members worked together to put on two very successful fundraisers

Paula and Debbie did a wonderful job of coordinating everything so that the evening went smoothly. We had 97 people attend and were able to raise close to \$23,000. When you consider this event was at the tail end of the first round of COVID, it's incredibly impressive.
- The Night at the Races was led by Robyn Gattozzi and Ali Wilson. This event was held at St Noel's Banquet Center in Willoughby Hills. Robyn and Ali also did a wonderful job coordinating this event. There were about 150 people in attendance and over \$18,000 was raised.

These two fundraisers combined raised over \$41,000...which will go right back to our community via our grant process. Bravo!

I am hoping that next year will be even better. We will have a Strategic Planning Session in September which will help us to evaluate where we are in 2022 and then where we want to go in the future. I truly hope that our members take the time to participate so that we have a better idea of what our organization needs to stay vital for the next 60 years.

Thank you all for making this year a very successful year for WRJSL and our community.
